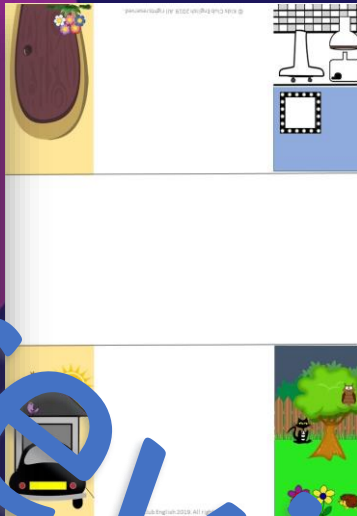


Folding House Craft

Print double-sided and follow the folding instructions

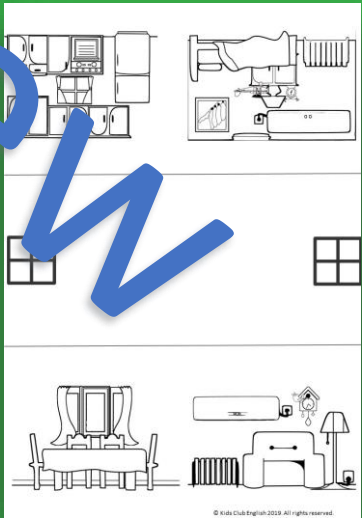
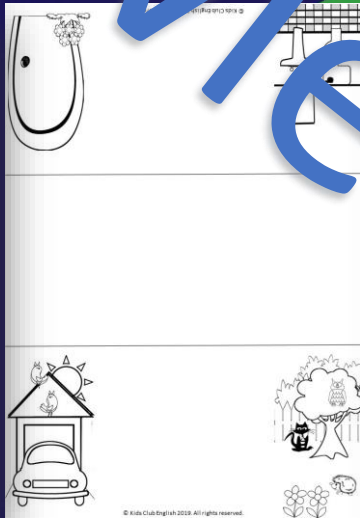
Instructions for making your folding house

Print your chosen templates back to back. The following example is with the completed colour house.

1. Fold the template in half. Fold in half again. Open out then fold each side into the centre fold.
2. Take each corner and push down to create the roof.
3. Open out and glue the black sections. Glue down to secure folds.

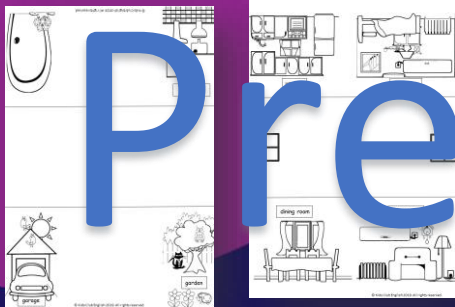

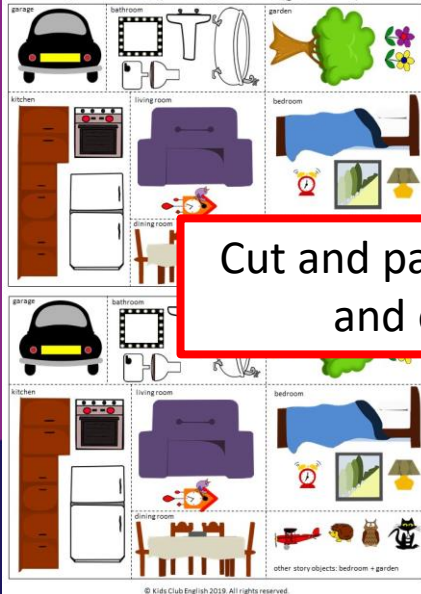

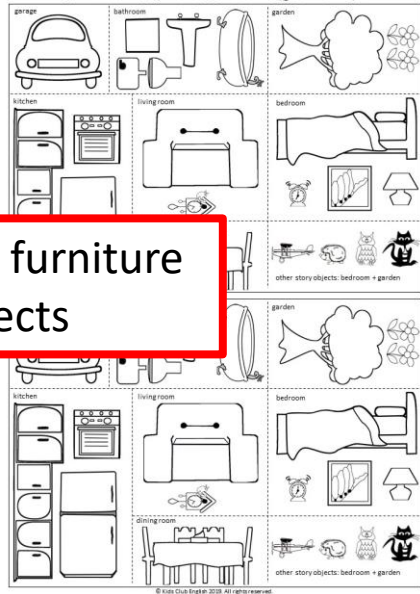


Furniture and objects images - small

Folding house craft

There are three versions of this folding house craft, all available in colour or black and white:

1. Completed template: Includes furniture and other objects
2. Completed template - rooms only: Includes all furniture and other objects
3. Bare room templates: Furniture and other objects include separate pieces for cutting and pasting

The rooms in this template are: living room, kitchen, bathroom, bedrooms, dining room, garage, garden. Furniture and objects include: car, sink, toilet, mirror, tree, flowers, hedgehog, cat, owl, table and chairs, fridge, cupboard, covers, sofa, clock, bed, picture, lamp, alarm clock, bag.

Download your chosen template, print, cut out, and use any accessories that you have. Then make it into a language pack or practice making this craft. Focus on the room labels, furniture, animal, rooms and furniture together and for work on classroom language.

Activity suggestions:

1. Tell the children the name of a room to colour.
 - Tell the children the name of an object to colour or furniture to colour
 - Ask the children where an object fits, identify a room, e.g. "Where is the mirror?"
 - Use the objects to identify the room in colour by changing each room number.
 - Describe an object for the children, "It's big, it's in the living room."
 - Use the furniture or other objects to identify the room/object.
2. Use these templates with the cut and paste ideas.
 - Place a label and picture on each room before the children cut and paste the objects. Set the suggestion in the printed box for easy to do this.
 - Ask how many things go in each room before the children cut and paste. How many things can they see that go in the bedroom?
 - Use the objects for each room before the children cut and paste.
 - Use the objects to identify the room/object.
 - Older children may enjoy reading their own function for each room. They can compare their rooms afterwards. How many similarities? Differences can they find? Label the rooms/object.
 - Older children can label the rooms and objects. Use next labels to name cards! Reproduce as a game for spelling.
3. Ask the children to make a house.
 - All of our popular stories with the author cut and paste. Some stories that work well are: *Goodnight Mister Tom*, *Stickleback* by The Three Bears, and *Little Duck* by David Almond.
 - Describe the position of furniture and objects in their house. Can they find similarities and differences with the room?
 - Use the objects to identify the room/object.
